## Save the Date: VACAP Summit Confirmed for October 10-11, 2023 (Richmond, Virginia)

VACAP's second annual Pathways from Poverty to Prosperity Summit will continue to include networking, encouragement, and hearing about key opportunities from strategic partners and funders. VACAP has confirmed October 10-11, 2023 at the Virginia Housing Center in Richmond. Please note this is a slight day change from the original tentative date. #### Reminder of SNAP and Medicaid Changes - Resources to Assist

COVID-19 Emergency SNAP Allotments are ending, with recent federal changes. This ends the Virginia Department of Social Services' authorization to issue benefits through that temporary federal program, which began in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. **Recipients received their final payment of these additional benefits on February 16.** 

It's estimated about 460,000 Virginia households are losing their emergency Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. Some estimates predict a loss of \$178 per month to households, and an overall monthly statewide decrease of \$69 million. However, some households will see dramatic decreases in support, especially seniors.

A temporary phone line for information set up by the Virginia Poverty Law Center opened January 30. Families may call 1-855-635-4370, weekdays from 7:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Virginians can also contact VPLC's SNAP Helpline at 866-753-7627.

Federal changes also end the Medicaid continuous coverage requirement. Since March 2020, all existing and new Medicaid enrollees were kept in coverage even if their circumstances changed. Starting this month, March 2023, the more than 2.1 million Virginians enrolled in Medicaid will have their eligibility re-evaluated. This will take place over a 12-month unwinding period.

Virginia's Department of Medical Assistance Services estimates that up to 400,000 members could lose coverage during this time.

#### Youngkin's Workforce Development Bill passes House and Senate

Glenn Youngkin's top legislative priorities — a bill to consolidate dozens of programs — is headed to his desk after both the House of Delegates and state Senate voted Tuesday to enact the change. The new Department of Workforce Development and Advancement would be the administrator and fiscal agent — the money manager— for state programs that help people train for and find jobs.

#### **USDA** Food Access Funding Opportunities

USDA NIFA: Nutrition Incentive Program

Minimum Award: \$500,000 Due Date: May 4, 2023

The GusNIP Nutrition Incentive Program presents the opportunity to bring together stakeholders from various parts of the food and healthcare systems to foster understanding of how they might improve the health and nutrition status of participating households. Applications should support and evaluate projects intended to increase the purchase of fruits and vegetables by providing incentives at the point of purchase among income eligible consumers participating in the USDA Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

### Office of Community Services (OCS) Funding Opportunities Community Economic Development (CED) NOFO

Max Award: 800,000 per project

Due Date: May 8, 2023

Eligible projects include those that are designed to address the economic needs of individuals and families with low income, through the creation of employment and business opportunities. ### Community Economic Development (CED) Focus of Energy Communities NOFO

Max Award: \$800,00 per project

Due Date: May 17, 2023

The Focus on Energy Communities program has the same overarching purpose and strategies as the CED program, but with a focus on projects located in and serving energy communities. CED projects that will be located in and serve energy communities – communities that have either experienced employment loss and /or economic dislocation events as a result of declines in the



fossil fuel industry and/or are disproportionately reliant on fossil fuel energy production or distribution, including coal, oil, gas, and power plant communities across the country. Projects may

include the creation or expansion of business(es) that reduce emissions of toxic substances and greenhouse gases from existing and abandoned infrastructure and that prevent environmental damage that harms communities and poses a risk to public health and safety. Projects may also employ individuals from energy communities but focus on a range of other industries. The overall goal of this effort will be to create good-paying jobs, spur economic revitalization, remediate environmental degradation, and support energy workers. ## The Department of Housing and Community Development's Affordable and Special Needs Housing (ASNH) Program

Max Award:

\$700,000 – Maximum request per source (HOME Investment Partnership Grant, National Housing Trist Fund (NHTF), or Virginia Housing Trust Fund (VHTF)

\$900,000 – Maximum request per source for projects providing qualified Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) units

\$2,100,000 – Maximum award for a project requesting HOME, NHTF and VHTF

\$2,400,000 – Maximum award for a project providing qualified PSH units and requesting HOME, NHTF, and VHTF

Due Date: April 4, 2023

The ASNH Program is the consolidated, competitive application used by DHCD to award National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF), Home Investment Partnerships (HOME), Virginia Housing Trust Fund (VHTF), and Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) funds towards the development of affordable multifamily rental and single-family homeownership projects across the Commonwealth.
