New Grant Opportunities: Housing and Energy

Virginia Housing's Community Impact Innovation Grant Program will begin accepting applications on Monday, January 6, 2025. This program supports breakthroughs in both housing affordability and housing services, primarily with regard to serving low- and moderate-income households.

The final application deadline for all of Virginia Energy's Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Subgrant applications will be Friday, December 13, 2024. These subgrants will allow for marketing, education, and outreach for energy efficiency and conservation programs for residential energy consumers and contractors.

Additionally, the Department of Energy has announced a competitive grant for energy improvements in communities of 10,000 or fewer. Grant awards will range from \$2M-\$50M. Concept papers are due February 27, 2025, and full applications are due August 28, 2025.

New Toolkit: Understanding and Using Wraparound Services

As part of their Community Economic Development Month in October, OCS released a new toolkit about understanding and utilizing wraparound services, including several examples of successful wraparound models in action. Two case studies are highlighted at the end of the report: a local Department of Health and Human Services that partnered with multiple community services organizations in a "Collaborative Management Program" to provide wraparound services for at-risk youth and families, and a statewide nonprofit organization that is addressing poverty through extensive and holistic wraparound services.

Federal Judge Strikes Down DOL Overtime Rule

The Council of Nonprofits recently reported that a federal district judge in Texas invalidated the Labor Department's overtime rule that sought to raise the minimum salary level that white collar employees must be paid to remain exempt from overtime pay. The ruling has essentially returned the pay minimum to the 2019 level of \$35,568 per year (\$684 per week).

Tax Relief a tough sell for Virginia Senate Democrats, even just a rebate

The state Senate's chief budget writer had a basic message about more tax relief at the Senate Finance Committee's annual retreat: No. Not if that means ongoing measures, said Senate Finance Committee chair Louise Lucas, D-Portsmouth. Asked if that could leave open a one-time tax break, like the \$110 rebate for single filers and \$220 for joint filers that the General Assembly approved in 2019, she said maybe.

Judge deems Youngkin's actions to withdraw Virginia from RGGI 'unlawful' By CHARLIE PAULLIN, Virginia Mercury

Floyd County Circuit Court Judge Randall Lowe ruled Wednesday Republican Gov. Glenn Youngkin acted unlawfully by withdrawing Virginia from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, a program aimed to reduce climate changing emissions that has funneled hundreds of millions to the state to deal with the impacts of extreme weather events. In his five page opinion, Lowe wrote that "the only body with the authority to repeal the RGGI regulation would be the General Assembly. This is because a statute, the RGGI Act, requires the RGGI regulation to exist."

Youngkin touts new digital portal for Veterans services

Gov. Glenn Youngkin says Virginia is offering a new way for military veterans to find services they need. Youngkin, speaking at a Veterans Day luncheon in Virginia Beach on Monday, said the Virginia Veterans Network will be a one-stop digital portal for veterans to use instead of searching for options to get help. He described the new network as a "gold-star hub for veterans to go to one place and find everything that they need, one place you can search and find, one place where you can say, 'I need' and we can respond."

Executive Action Announced to Catalyze Growth of Workforce Housing Supply

RICHMOND, VA - On November 14, Governor Glenn Youngkin announced the Workforce Housing Investment Program, a new initiative at Virginia Housing that will invest \$75 million over five years with the potential to catalyze \$750 million and build 5,000 units of workforce housing in conjunction with economic development projects in the Commonwealth.

The Governor also issued Executive Order 42, which formally ties economic development to workforce housing supply by enhancing the alignment between economic development announcements and housing availability in the Commonwealth.
